
1. Sitting properly

4. Placing the seatbelt across the middle and above the legs (in case of pregnancy) not to be placed above the middle.




One dotted line: warning from danger and not allowing overtaking unless one's sure the road ahead is clear

One continuous non-dotted line:


Overtaking isn't allowed in case of entering or exiting one of the buildings or sub-roads, in the case of a traffic officer ordering so or when avoiding an obstacle in the road


Vehicle must stop completely behind the double line along the track at junctions even without the stop sign


the line across the track at junctions usually has a "stop" sign and the vehicle must stop completely at the white line.




Dotted single or double lines along the track at junctions means the driver must give way to the vehicles coming from the left and drive carefully after checking that the road on the left is clear


Areas marked with diagonal lines are to separate traffics going in one way but on the side of the middle sidewalk in a gradual separation. It's prohibited for vehicles to pass over these lines


Arrows indicate the correct track which the driver should take in the coming junction, depending on the intended turn. There are traffic lights at the junction and near the roundabouts, be sure to always take the right track.





1. Make sure doors are securely closed



2. Ensure the seat is well-adjusted



3. Adjust mirrors



4. Check the gearshift



5. Check the indicators and lights in the dashboard



6. Buckle the seat belt

5. Call 991 to be directed to the nearest station to direct the accident






2. when stepping out of the vehicle make sure to stand in a safe place, put the reflective triangle at safe distance.










1. Lower the speed to avoid accidents and landslides




2. Check the windscreen wipers
